




57% of respondents felt safe at work during COVID-19


Top 5 Preventive Measures: Staff COVID-19

Testing & quarantining new committals	11.7%
Screening at entry to prison facilities	11.1%
Full PPE when interacting with committals	9.6%


Top 5 Preventive Measures: Prisoner COVID-19

Testing & quarantining new committals	20.2%
Suspending family visits	17.4%
Cleaning shower rooms & common areas	15.3%
Wearing face masks during out-of-cell time	12.9%






