Management in the Operations Directorate reissued Operations Circular OPS/6/2016 - Next of Kin to all Governors and requested that Class Officer speak to each prisoner to verify/amend/add that of kin details on PIMS.

For clarification purposes - There are no implications of being nominated as "next-of-kin" as there is no legal definition within Irish Law for a next of kin
